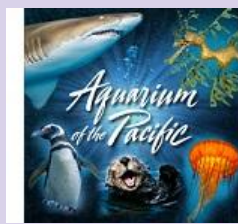

Pick Up and Drop Off Procedures

AM CLASSES- GATES CLOSE AT 8:00 AM PM CLASSES- GATES CLOSE AT 11:40 AM

Students who arrive after gates have closed need to go to the front office to receive a tardy slip.

- **Street parking only**
 - No drive-thru drop off or pick up
 - Please do not park in Staff Parking
- Use crosswalks
- Parent / caregiver must walk with the child
- No playground use before or after school
- Older students may not wait by the gate for kinder PM pick up
 - 1st-5th grade students must be accompanied by an adult

Independent Study



Attendance

- Can request ISC for 5-20 consecutive days
- We appreciate a request *at least* 3 weeks in advance or ASAP
 - District Policy: 5 day contract= 3-5 days ahead, 5 or more days up to 20=5-7 days ahead MINIMUM
- Does NOT replace teaching
- ONE ISC per school year
- If incomplete, any future requests can be denied (future years)

- In classroom/line **before** 8:00 bell or student is tardy
- Examples of unexcused absences and tardies: family vacations, attending sporting events, oversleeping, running late
- A truancy letter goes home when 7+ days missed due to unexcused absences or tardies

Absences Add Up!

If a student misses...	Which equals...	Which is...
One day every two weeks	20 days per year	4 weeks per year
One day a week	40 days per year	8 weeks per year
Two days a week	80 days per year	16 weeks per year
Three days a week	120 days per year	24 weeks per year

And Tardies Add Up, Too!

If a student is missing just...	Which equals...	Which is...
10 minutes per day	50 minutes per week	Nearly 1.5 weeks per year
20 minutes per day	100 minutes per week	Over 2.5 weeks per year
30 minutes per day	Almost an day per week	4 weeks per year

Students can feel lost and disconnected when they begin their day late.
